

'LEARN' words at BATHTIME



Label



- Name it

Say what it is Soap, Shampoo, Sponge, Jug, Towel, Duck, Whale, Boat, Body parts: Head, Tummy, Toes, Face





Say what you're 'doing' (whilst doing it) Pouring, Washing, Drying, Splashing,



Comment on what your child is doing, e.g. 'you are squeezing the sponge. It's so wet!'

Explore

- Talk about it

What we do with it Wash/Dry ourselves, Pour, Play, Squeeze

The type of thing it is An animal, a toy, a part of the body, a vehicle...



What it looks like Empty, Full A bit of.../A lot of...



Feel like? Wet, Dry, Hot, Cold, Soft, Fluffy, Soapy, Heavy, Light

Appreciate ****

- Enjoy words

Play word games:

- "I had a bath and, in that bath, I put a duck, a whale, a jug..." (list as many items as possible)
- "I spy with my little eye, something that we pour with..."



Openly show your enjoyment of words

"Splash, splash, splash! I love that word – splash!" (be enthusiastic and lively as you say it)

Repeat



Use the same word many times to help your child to remember it.

Use the word in **sentences** using *repetition*, e.g: "Washing face" "Washing arms" "Washing toes!"

Read books about

bathtime



Sing the same song lots of times, e.g: "If you're happy and you know it, clap vour hands, wash your toes..."

New



- Add new words

Add brand new words

Dolphin, Starfish, Fishing rod, Net, Watering can...

Build on what they already know If they know 'foot', then teach the names of the parts of the foot (ankle, toes, heel)

Use words that mean the same/ the opposite of a word they know, e.g:

- if they know 'wet'. then use 'soaking/soaked'
